Course Description:

World Literature is a college preparatory course which examines global perspectives through various time periods. The student develops an understanding of literature as a product of its culture and recognizes the commonalities and differences among works of literature from different times and places in the world. Students reflect on these elements of culture through the careful reading and interpretation of texts, through writing, and through speaking with and listening to others. Students will also grow in research skills, daily grammar practice, vocabulary development, and critical thinking and awareness.

Grading:

• (including summative assessments such as annotated bibliography, argumentative essay, narrative essay, Socratic seminar, etc.)

35% Minor Assignments

• (including formative assessments such as CEI paragraphs, class assignments, homework, etc.)

5% Critical Thinking & Engagement

• (including tickets-out-the-door, book/journal checks, procedural responsibilities, etc.)

10% Final Assessment

All texts for World Literature at Harrison High School were selected based on their relevance to the <u>Georgia Standards of Excellence</u> for 9th-10th grades. At this grade level, most texts explore mature themes and subjects and may include mature language. Parents are encouraged to research these titles and direct any questions concerning their content to the classroom teacher. In the case of parental objection to a text, an alternate text will be provided. Cobb County requires English teachers to obtain approval for readings not included in the school's adopted textbook. 
